BOARD MEETING MINUTES

Board Meeting Minutes

January 23, 1999, 7:00pm CST, Pike County Farm Bureau, Pittsfield, IL

Board Members: PRESENT

The meeting was called to order by O.R. Freesen at 7:10pm with a quorum present.

- I. O.R. Freesen welcomed club members. There were 84 people in attendance.
- II. O.R. introduced the board members present. He asked Durrell Miller to act as secretary due to Graham McNeill's absence.
- III. Minutes of the September 26, 1998 meeting were read and approved except for item VII, B, 3. The board will review that at the next meeting due to possible future proposals. Minutes of the October 24th meeting were read and approved adding item II to read *Temporary Amendment to By-laws: The new board amended the by-laws to add one permanent non-elected, non-officer, voting seat on the board for Tom Wombles as Founder and Chairman of the Jeep Jamboree.* The full membership will vote on this amendment at the next annual meeting in October 1999.
- IV. Comments from Club members were encouraged by O.R. at any time during the meeting.
- V. Officers Reports
 - A. Secretary Report - Durrell Miller - Club membership is at 186 including two new memberships received at the kickoff dinner.
 - B. Treasury Report - Durrell Miller - The cash balance as of 12/31/98 was \$12,574.01. Income for 1998 totaled \$17,898.39 with expenses of \$15,708.13. Therefore, a net contribution to cash in 1998 was \$2,190.26. (If you would like to see an itemized report for details, please contact Graham McNeill.)
- VI. Committee Reports
 - A. Trail leader and maintenance Report - Tim Miller - Trail guide training meetings will be held over two work weekends. This will allow all trail guides to participate as attendance will be mandatory. Notification will be given when scheduled. The next scheduled work weekend will be used for trail assessment on all trails.
 - B. Communications Report - Mary Ann Callarman - Members are asked to submit articles for the newsletter to Frank & Jude Fleeger, Editors of Two Rivers Tracker. It takes a lot of effort to publish 6 newsletters each year. Some help would be appreciated. Our club now has a web page in the making. The address is <http://www.aaronking.com/trjc/> Paul Beyer will be our webmaster reporting to the communication committee chairman. Paul asks that all club members review the site and contact him with your opinions.
 - C. Logo development/promotional items Report - Graham McNeill - no report.
 - D. Landowner Appreciation - Donnie Walston - Donnie said that the plan for 1999 is to improve landowner relations by implementing Landowner Appreciation Weekends. The club will offer assistance to landowners that can be performed in one day on a pre-planned work weekend. Donnie will work with the landowners to develop a schedule that can best serve the landowners.

- E. Event Coordination - John Toumbs - In his absence, O.R. said that John will have overall responsibility for the 4xFling this September. He will see that each club event has an effective coordinator reporting to John.

VII. Special Activities

- A. Trail building weekends - Tim Miller - Tim reported that the trail assessment will be done on the next scheduled weekend. He will notify trail guides of the mandatory training meetings.
- B. 7th Annual Land of Lincoln Jeep Jambo - Tom Wombles - Tom reported there are about 100 Jeeps signed up so far. O.R. asked about a contract with JJUSA to put on the event. Tom said the contract is the same as prior years. JJUSA will pay the club \$1,000. They will also provide 'about' 33 tickets for TRJC members to attend as support staff. Also, all necessary club expenses to support the event will be reimbursed, including a room for trail guides to shower during the event. Tom also reported that 8 or 9 trails will be used reducing the number of 8+ trails used last year. Landowner Syndy Miller stated that she had heard rumors that that the 6-rated Black Oak Run trail that is ½ on her land wasn't going to be used this year. Tom confirmed the rumor to be true stating that he shut the trail down for the Jamboree. When asked why this decision had not been communicated to the landowners, O.R. Freesen declared that the issue would be continued at an Executive Session of the Board immediately following the meeting.
- C. Father's Day Club Run - Durrell & Syndy Miller - It was reported that this years event is on schedule and will include several new family activities in addition to the annual trail ride.
- D. 4th of July Run - Tom Wombles - Tom reported that the event will be the same as last year and will be a good time for all.
- E. Pokey's Run - Donnie Walston - It was questioned whether or not this run is too close to the upcoming 4xFling. Donnie said that as long as there is interest, it will go on as scheduled.
- F. 4xFling - John Toumbs - John will oversee this event from planning to execution. The name has changed from 4xFall Blast.

VIII. Old Business

- A. Liability Insurance - O.R. Freesen - No report.
- B. Answering machine for Tom Wombles - no change.

IX. New Business

- A. A donation of \$250 was approved for the Rockport 4H Club for supporting our Halloween Club Run.
- B. Reimbursement for December 1998 landowner appreciation gifts was approved by the board not to exceed \$1,400.
- C. The initial budget for the 4xFling to be held in September was approved for \$1,000.
- D. The board approved \$361.13 expenses related to setting up of the Club's web page.
- E. A proposal to cap the membership of our club was discussed and approved at 225. Currently we have 186 memberships.
- F. A proposal to change the by-laws : Article VII, Section 1, memberships, was assigned to a committee chaired by Tom Wombles to study and make recommendation. The committee is to meet on February 20 and present their findings to the Board at the next full meeting.
- G. A proposal to change the by-laws: Article I, Section 2 and Section 3, Board of Directors Number and Qualifications, Election and Tenure was assigned to a committee chaired by Donnie Walston to study and make a recommendation to the Board.

X. Resolutions - as stated above by Board approval.

XI. The meeting adjourned at 10pm CST, with the Executive Session commencing immediately thereafter.

PRAYER CHAIN

In the past years TRJC has continued to grow and expand its vision to be more than just a "Jeep Club". Leadership has worked hard to develop the club into an organization which works to serve its members desires and also to reach out into the community to be an asset to the Pike County area. Friendships and relationships have developed, and many of us have become family-like. We have shared life with each other, good times and difficult times. Sometimes we know people are hurting and have needs, and we really don't know what to do or what to say to help them in their need, but we want to do something. In November of 1997 when I lay in the hospital with a near fatal disease, my spirits were lifted with cards and calls from friends and club members. But what healed and saved me were the countless prayers from friends and club members.

I would like to know if anyone in the TRJC would be interested in being part of a prayer chain. A group of people who will lift up members' needs in prayer, a way of doing something when you don't know what to do or say. The concept is very simple. There would be a list of prayer chain volunteers developed. The lead person would receive a request from someone about a need and then call the next person on the list. Everyone would have a complete list so if someone were not available, the caller would move down the list until he was able to pass the request along. The request may be as simple as so-and-so needs prayer to a detailed description of the situation. That part doesn't matter, God knows what the need is. We just need to be faithful and get as many people lifting up the need in prayer as possible.

This prayer chain would NOT be connected to the newsletter, so your privacy will be respected. If you desire to have a need printed, you would have to contact the editor.

Never having been on that trail before, we did not know where we were going. Therefore we were following closely, hoping all day we could encourage Carl to move faster in an effort for all of us to stay up with the pack. We did leave Carl and Cindy in the capable hands of two of our friends, in Jeeps to the rear, knowing if they found trouble they could be helped along. The friend following Carl for the balance of the day stated he also tailgated, looking for the chance to get around so he could catch up with the pack.

Cindy asks in the letter "At what point does the Trail Leader say enough is enough when people are attempting to traverse a challenge but are not succeeding? Cindy, you may have missed "the point"! The challenge is what trail riding is all about.... finding your limits and the limits of your Jeep. Yes, many people were standing around with very little to do . . . except learn!

We can learn a great deal by watching other people drive through a mean spot and we can learn even more from those who try and cannot get the job done. We can learn what tires work, what gears work, and what size lift is needed and even at what point things break. We were even exposed to a trail repair after breakage. AAA does not make trail calls!

There are other trails which enable drivers to learn trail driving skills without risk of damage and without lengthy delays. Mr. Hamer Tate has a very attractive trail that would be a pleasant run for your Jeep and is a nice skill builder. I promise he won't leave you behind.

DONATIONS

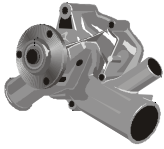

- School supplies for local children.

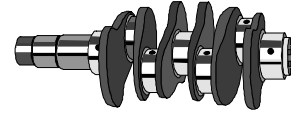
